Mr. Foulds presented a PowerPoint regarding the Freemasons of British Columbia and Yukon’s ‘Cancer Car’ Program. The Program provides free transportation for cancer patients to their medical appointments and began servicing Prince George on January 14, 2013. In the first year of operations in Prince George, the Freemasons Cancer Car vehicles travelled 9,267 kilometres and transported 1995 patients.

Applicant:

Ian Wells, Director of Planning and Development answered questions from Council on behalf of the City of Prince George.

Gallery:

Mr. McGraw came to Centre table and spoke in support of the application due to the increased membership of the Elder Citizens Recreation Association (ECRA). Mr. McGraw also acknowledged the existing Lease Agreement dated April 13, 2005 between the City of Prince George and ECRA regarding the occupy and use of the subject property. Mr. McGraw answered questions from Council and returned to the gallery.

Ms. Nadalin came to Centre table and spoke in support of the application. Ms. Nadalin offered landscaping services if the application were to be approved.

Ms. Gordon, a neighbouring resident to the subject property, came to Centre Table and spoke in opposition to the application. Ms. Gordon expressed concerns regarding the level of noise, increased traffic, increased dust, snow removal and impacts on property values. Ms. Gordon answered questions from Council and returned to the gallery.

Ms. Doering, a neighbouring resident to the subject property, came to Centre Table and spoke in opposition to the application. Ms. Doering expressed that she did not believe the addition of 18 stalls would be a solution to the existing parking issue. Ms. Doering also raised concerns regarding the existing drainage issue during snow melt and the potential impact of the subject parking lot. Ms. Gordon returned to the gallery.

Mr. Sweet came to Centre table and provided recommendations to Council regarding increased dust and opportunities to increase parking. Mr. Sweet returned to the gallery.

Ms. Demeyer came to Centre table and spoke in opposition to the application. Ms. Demeyer raised concerns regarding the size of events that take place at the ECRA facility and the small impact the addition of 18 stalls will have in those circumstances. Ms. Demeyer returned to the gallery.

Mr. Iwaskow came to Centre table and spoke in support of the application. Mr. Iwaskow commented on the fact that his parents, who have mobility issues, would be positively impacted by the approval of the subject parking lot as there would be increased parking in close proximity to the facility. Mr. Iwaskow also expressed that the parking lot would be an addition to the ECRA facility and would help to alleviate the existing parking issues on 10th avenue. Mr. Iwasko returned to the gallery.

Mr. Jenkel came to Centre table and spoke in support of the application. Mr. Jenkle noted the support received from the community when petitioning for approval of the application and the benefit of the parking lot for ECRA members.
