By completing this elector response form I oppose the municipal council’s intention to adopt **14th Avenue Upgrades (Irwin Street to Freeman Street) Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 9013, 2019**, which authorizes the borrowing not to exceed the sum of one million two hundred thousand dollars (\$1,200,000) to be repaid over a period not exceeding twenty (20) years, in order to finance the cost to rebuild approximately 280m of 14th Avenue, between Irwin Street and Freeman Street to facilitate development along this corridor, as described in more detail on page 2 of this form.

The municipal council may proceed with the adoption of **14th Avenue Upgrades (Irwin Street to Freeman Street) Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 9013, 2019**, unless five thousand, five hundred and forty six (5,546) electors submit a completed copy of this elector response form to the City of Prince George by the deadline established. **A person may not sign more than one elector response form in relation to this alternative approval process.** Additional information can be found below about the subject of this alternative approval process as well as the elector qualifications.

Additional information about 14th Avenue Upgrades (Irwin Street to Freeman Street) Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 9013, 2019:

This project is to rebuild approximately 280m of 14th Avenue, between Irwin Street and Freeman Street to facilitate development along this corridor. The upgrades are to improve the existing sub-City-standard roadway to a 20m urban, local roadway. Upgrades include: replacement and extension of the existing water main on 14th Ave with size to accommodate future multifamily residential development, extension of existing sanitary sewer main on 14th Avenue, extension of the existing storm sewer and catch basins, curb and gutter on both sides of 14th Avenue, sidewalk on one side of 14th Avenue, and street lights along 14th Avenue.

Additional information about elector eligibility:

In order to sign this elector response form a person must either be a resident elector or a non-resident property elector (not both).

A **resident elector** is an individual who is qualified to vote in a jurisdiction by virtue of living in the jurisdiction. To sign this elector response form as a resident elector a person must:

- be a Canadian citizen;
- be at least 18 years of age;
- have lived in British Columbia for at least the last six (6) months; and
- have lived within the City of Prince George for at least the last thirty (30) days.

A **non-resident property elector** is an individual who does not live in a jurisdiction but is entitled to vote in an election there by virtue of owning property in that jurisdiction. To sign this elector response form as a non-resident property elector a person must:

- be a Canadian citizen;
- be at least 18 years of age;
- have lived in British Columbia for at least the last six (6) months; and
- have owned property within the City of Prince George for at least the last thirty (30) days.

Note that if a property is owned by more than one individual, only one of them may sign an elector response form. If a property is owned by more than one individual, then the person signing this elector response form declares that they have received the written consent of the majority of the property owners to sign and submit this elector response form.
