- Participants receive a City pin

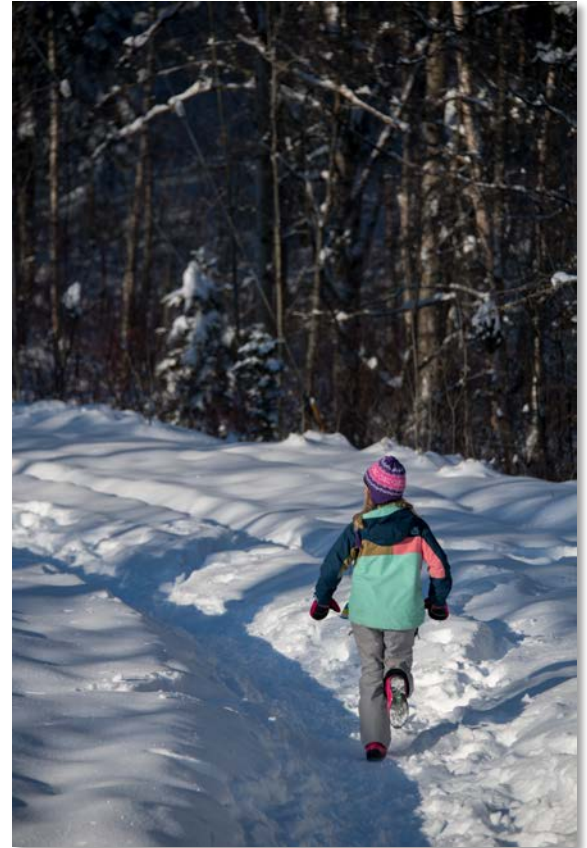
Students will be led through City Hall to assemble in Council Chambers where they will have the opportunity to meet the Mayor and participate in a Q&A or a short presentation from representatives of one or more City departments.

Tours run approximately 60 minutes and are led by Office of the Mayor Staff and representatives from various City departments. Teachers and group leaders may choose up to three (3) presentations or activities. Each presentation runs between 5-10 minutes and includes a Q&A.

Tours will visit active areas of City Hall, so students are asked to be respectful of staff and patrons who are working and conducting business.

Notes:

- Morning tours generally start at 9:30 a.m., and afternoon tours at 12:30 p.m., but we are flexible and will try to accommodate the school schedule;
- Date availability is based on the availability of rooms within City Hall. Due to civic meetings and other events availability may change.

Legislative Services

The Legislative Services presentation highlights the function of municipal government and the importance of active citizenship. Presenters provide information on how council meetings are run, how decisions are made, and the voting process.

Community Partnerships / Recreation / Mr. PG

This presentation is full of fun facts and history about Mr. PG as well as information about the programs offered through our Community Partners and the events happening in our city.

Human Resources

This presentation is an opportunity for students in grades 10-12 to learn about the diverse opportunities within the City, the hiring process and what recruiters are looking for in a potential employee.

Find out why the City of Prince George flies the Lheidli T'enneh flag outside of City Hall and learn about the relationship between the City of Prince George and the Lheidli T'enneh and the initiatives we are working on together.
