  - i. *A rapid application approval turnaround.*
  - ii. *That the program design include consideration of a cost-recovery model (i.e., a pay per-play fee for rapid applications) and an accountability framework for repeat deficiencies.*
  - iii. *Eligibility criteria for the approved list.*
