- the acquisition, disposition or expropriation of land or improvements, if the council considers that disclosure could reasonably be expected to harm the interests of the municipality; pursuant to subsection 90(1)(e) of the Community Charter.
- law enforcement, if the council considers that disclosure could reasonably be expected to harm the conduct of an investigation under or enforcement of an enactment; pursuant to subsection 90(1)(f) of the Community Charter.
- the receipt of advice that is subject to solicitor-client privilege, including communications necessary for that purpose; pursuant to subsection 90(1)(i) of the Community Charter.
- the consideration of whether the authority under section 91 [other persons attending closed meetings] should be exercised in relation to a council meeting; pursuant to subsection 90(1)(o) of the Community Charter.
- the consideration of information received and held in confidence relating to negotiations between the municipality and a first nation or prescribed Indigenous entity, or between a first nation or a prescribed Indigenous entity and a third party; pursuant to subsection 90(2)(b)(iii) of the Community Charter.
