

CITY OF PRINCE GEORGE

BYLAW NO. 5838

A Bylaw of the City of Prince George to regulate the operation of Food Service Establishments.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 692 of the Municipal Act, Council may, by bylaw, regulate persons, their premises and their activities, to further the care, protection, promotion and preservation of the health of the inhabitants of the municipality;

AND WHEREAS Council has deemed it expedient and in the public interest to require proprietors of food service establishments to ensure that at least one on-duty supervisor at the establishments has successfully completed the Provincial FOODSAFE program;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Prince George in open meeting assembled, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. DEFINITIONS:

For the purposes of this Bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires:

(a) "FOODSAFE Training and Certificate Program" means the Provincial FOODSAFE sanitation program for foodhandlers;

(b) "Food Service Establishment" means:

(i) those food premises, permanent or temporary, fixed or moveable, in which food is prepared or similarly made ready for eating, or

(ii) any eating or drinking establishment where draught drink or prepared food is served to the public;

including any restaurant, coffee shop, cafeteria, short-order cafe, deli, grill, take-out, sandwich shop, soda fountain, bar, tavern, pub, beer parlour, cocktail lounge, dining room night club, catering kitchen, industrial feeding establishment, commissary, concession or other similar place.

(c) "Supervisor" means a person in charge or agent of the Food Service Establishment owner; including a person acting on his/her own behalf where a formal supervisor is not designated.

- 2. No person, being the proprietor of a food service establishment, shall permit the handling or preparation of food unless there is at least one supervisor on duty in the food preparation area who is responsible to ensure that the food is handled and prepared in a safe and sanitary manner at any time that food is handled or prepared, and who has a valid statement to certify successful completion of the FOODSAFE Sanitation Program for food handlers.
- 3. The on duty supervisor shall post the FOODSAFE Statement of Completion Certificate in a prominent place in the food service establishment to which it relates.
- 4. This Bylaw shall take effect on April 30th, 1993.
- 5. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Bylaw is liable upon summary conviction, to penalties provided for under the Offence Act or the City of Prince George Municipal Ticketing Information Utilization Bylaw. Each day that a violation occurs shall be deemed to be a separate violation against this Bylaw.
- 6. This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as "City of Prince George Food Handler Bylaw No. 5838, 1992".

READ A FIRST TIME THIS THE 24th DAY OF August, 1992.
 READ A SECOND TIME THIS THE 24th DAY OF August, 1992.
 READ A THIRD TIME THIS THE 24th DAY OF August, 1992.
